

### ELITE LEAGUE PROVIDES OPPORTUNITY FOR UPPER MIDWEST HOCKEY PLAYERS

Welcome to the 2010 Bauer National Invitational Tournament. This weekend's tournament is the final event of the 2009 season for the Upper Midwest High School Elite League, a league formed to provide growth opportunities for the game of hockey, and for players from across the Upper Midwest.

It's no secret that Minnesotans love their high school hockey. It's part of the culture here in "The State of Hockey," coming to a peak each March with the Minnesota State High School Hockey Tournament, a four-day showcase that draws more than 100,000 fans to St. Paul.

However, about a decade ago many of the state's premier players found themselves looking for an opportunity to play more games, and against stronger competition, than a normal high school season provided. The Upper Midwest High School Elite League was founded to help meet that need.

Each year, the league conducts an extensive series of tryouts, talks to coaches around the state and selects about 120 players to compete in the Elite League's fall season. Teams are formed around - and named after - geographic regions, giving the league Team Northeast, Team Southeast, Team Northwest, Team Southwest, Team North and Team Great Plains. Add in Team Wisconsin, and a team from the Shattuck-St. Mary's school program, and you have an eight-team league that competes for eight consecutive weekends from September through October.

League games are played mostly on Saturdays and Sundays, allowing players to continue to play football, soccer or other fall sports for their high schools. Teams complete a 21-game regular season schedule, then play three more games in the league playoffs. At the end of those playoffs about 40 players are selected to form the two Minnesota teams – Red and White – that compete in this weekend's National Invitational Tournament.

Now completing its 10th season, the Elite League provides a tremendous opportunity for players to develop their skills against other premier players, and also provides a showcase for displaying those skills in front of scouts and coaches from organizations throughout hockey. On a typical Elite League weekend, dozens of scouts and coaches from junior teams, colleges and NHL teams are in attendance, helping provide a pathway for players who want to continue their hockey careers.

Last June, 18 players from the Elite League – a record number - were selected in the NHL Entry Draft, and this weekend you will have the chance to see a number of players who are already committed to Division I college programs.

So sit back and enjoy the NIT, knowing that you are seeing the "stars of tomorrow" at an early point in their hockey careers.



#### 2010 Upper Midwest High School Elite League Notes

Lots of talent and a great competitive balance contributed to make the 10th season of the Upper Midwest High School Elite League its most exciting season ever.

First came a regular season race that went down to the very last Sunday afternoon, and ended with Team North and Team Northwest in a tie as league co-champions. The teams had split their first two meetings of the season, but North's three-game sweep of the final weekend – including a 6-4 win over Northwest – created a tie for the title as both teams went 13-7-1.

Team North's campaign was truly a team effort. They did not have a single scorer among the league's top 12, being led by Garrett Hendrickson's six goals and 20 points.

Just one point behind them was Team Southeast, which made a rush for the championship by winning its final seven games of the season, falling just short with a 12-7-2 record.

None of those three teams, however, would make it to the league playoff championship game. That crown went to Team Great Plains, which had just an 8-12-1 regular season mark, but got hot at the right time to advance to the championship game. There they met Team Northeast, the league's 8th-place team in the regular season, and Great Plains' 7-5 win earned them the title.

"There was fast, exciting hockey all season long," said Elite League founder and Commissioner John Russo. "We had great balance among the teams and fans across the Upper Midwest had a chance to see these players competing at a very high level among other elite players."

In addition to excitement of the regular season and playoff tournaments, there were a number of exceptional individual performances as well, including:

- Tony Cameranesi of Team Northwest. The Wayzata senior had 16 goals and 17 assists to earn the league scoring championship with 33 points
- Team Wisconsin's Brad Navin and Team Southwest's Kyle Rau, who tied Cameranesi for the league goal-scoring title with 16
- Goalie Alex Lyon of Team North. The senior from Lake of the Woods had a 2.76 goals-against average and .930 save percentage, both best in the league.

In its 10th season, the league also went on the road again, giving fans a chance to see Elite League action in Duluth, Grand Rapids, Brainerd, Fargo, Eau Claire, Wausau and Stevens Point. A number of Elite League players have already made Division I commitments for upcoming seasons, and others will be making those decisions after appearing in the NIT this weekend. The league had nearly two dozen players on the NHL Central Scouting Service's "Players to Watch" list that was released in October.

Having now completed a decade of providing exposure and competition to the Upper Midwest's elite hockey players, the league will focus on constant improvement and even greater opportunities for its players.


